The Boys on the Plaque Graffiti Exhibition Cultureground@The Jubilee Library

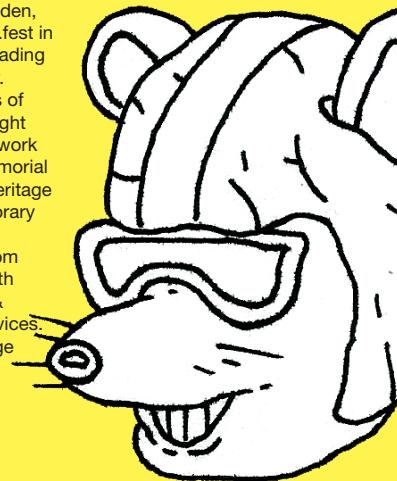
